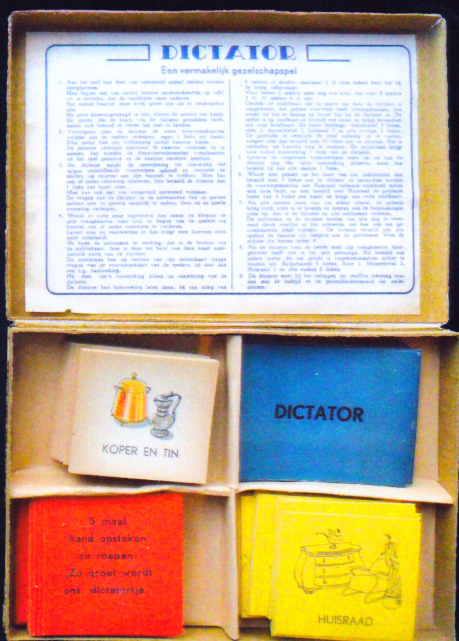


In the last issue of the *AGPI Quarterly* (Vol 8 No. 4, Winter 2024) Jim Polczynski wrote an article about games depicting dictators—a 1937 game titled “*The Game of Conquest - Dealing with Dictators*,” by The Old Army Game Publishing Company of Oklahoma, OK, and “*Dictator*” dated 1939 by Waltham Industries, Inc. from Waltham, MA .

A recent email from Fred Horn indicated another *Dictator* game published in 1946 by the firm Luctor and printer Drukkerij Stadler & Sauerbier of Rotterdam, Netherlands.



DICTATOR is a satirical game on the theme of “handing in forbidden radios.” On the box lid is a caricature of Mussolini. One player plays the dictator, aided by a second player whose role is the police. The game revolves around the requisition of various goods, whereby the possession of the forbidden radio costs 5 penalty points. For other objects less so.

The player who plays the police may conduct a search. The game consists of a box with four stacks of cards.
